BUNNY MAINTENANCE

A GUIDE ON HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR BUN BUN

This guide will help you with things to consider for looking after your bun(s).



BUNNY CARE

ENSURE YOU CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING

- 1) Worming: every 6-8 weeks.
 - a. Every rabbit should be wormed
 - b. Use Revolution Pink for Puppies and Kittens only
- 2) Vaccinations: minimum annually.
 - a. Filofax annual injections are critical (this covers your bun from the calicivirus which is deadly)
 - b. Get this done by your rabbit-savvy veterinarian when you have an annual check up
- Feed/water: daily.
 - a. Ensure fresh water
 - b. Ensure the bun has access to unlimited hay
 - c. Ensure your bun(s) have access to a cup of pellets
- 4) Grooming: daily.
 - a. Brush coat
 - b. Clip mats off
 - c. Check no poop stuck to butt and fur (check with your vet on how best to handle your rabbit if you find you are having issues)
 - d. Clip nails when required
- 5) Exercise: daily.
 - a. Your rabbit needs to exercise daily (this helps keep their digestive system as healthy as possible)
 - They love grass, gardens for digging, shaded areas and food/water access
- 6) First Aid: on hand.
 - It is good to help have some things on hand to help your buns out
 - b. Meloxycam (from your vet only), this is an excellent pain relief
 - c. Vetafarm Origins Insect & Mite spray
 - d. Infant gas drops
 - e. Little syringes to administer liquid medication to
 - f. Critical Care
 - g. Baby wipes
 - h. Grooming mat (to put your rabbits on for grooming and medical handling)
 - i. Eye drops
- 7) Signs of Being Unwell: take them to the vet straight away
 - a. Ears back
 - b. Lethargic
 - c. Sitting in a more tucked position than usual
 - d. Not eating/drinking and not interested in treats (such as bananas, oats, continental parsley/kale)
